
- Town Halls held on 9/13, 9/16, 9/25
- 90-minute discussion focused on FFPSA case documentation and federal reimbursement requirements for preventive services

KEY TAKE-AWAYS: CANDIDACY

- Child Welfare Services Track
 - FFPSA prevention candidate child in an open mandated or non-mandated preventive services case, not in an active foster care placement, and receiving a NYS approved FFPSA EBP.
 - FFPSA pregnant & parenting candidate in foster care, parenting and receiving a NYS approved FFPSA EBP.
- Healthy Families NY Track
 - any child who meets HFNY screening criteria; child can be, but does not have to be, receiving preventive services.
 - Can enroll family pre-birth up to target child's second birthday.
 - Can claim for services from target child's birth through age 5.

KEY TAKE-AWAYS: CANDIDACY

• FFPSA candidacy supersedes traditional candidacy, if the child fits both criteria.



More children will potentially qualify for FFPSA candidacy than are eligible for traditional candidacy, as both mandated and nonmandated prevention cases are eligible when a FFPSA EBP is provided.

KEY TAKE-AWAYS: STATUS OF FEDERAL REVIEW

- NYS Title IV-E Prevention Services Plan was approved by Administration for Children and Families in August of 2022
- Prior to submitting claims for federal reimbursement, NYS must also have an approved Cost Allocation Plan (CAP)
 - Local District Cost Allocation Plan
 – approved summer 2024
 - Districts should now be documenting provision of contracted FFPSA EBP services to eligible children/families within the FASP
 - LDSS provided MI and Healthy Families New York (HFNY) CAPS are still under review

KEY TAKE-AWAYS: SERVICE COSTS

Three EBP Provision Pathways

LDSS Purchased

Covers any of the 11 NYS approved EBPs, including MI, when provided by a contracted partner. Cost allocation plan approved.

Motivational Interviewing Provided by LDSS Staff

Districts will be able to claim for a portion of eligible staff salaries when MI trained caseworkers engage in face-to-face contacts with eligible families.



Approved

Healthy Families NY

Districts can refer at no local cost. Families may, but are not required to have, an open preventive case. Referrals can be made at any time, but NYS will not be able to seek federal reimbursement until CAP is approved.

Cost Allocation

KEY TAKE-AWAYS: MOTIVATIONAL INTERVIEWING

- Purchased from contracted partner (CAP approved)
 - As a stand-alone service claimed like any other EBP.
 - In conjunction with another NYS FFPSA approved EBP claim as one service, based on whatever model is primary.
 - In conjunction with a non-NYS FFPSA approved EBP if cost of MI component can be isolated, can claim for that portion of service contract.
- Provided by LDSS staff (CAP pending)
 - Requires caseworker have MI training and new casework contacts documentation/functionality in CONNECTIONS.
 - To participate, LDSS must engage in fidelity monitoring with Center for Excellence (CfE) – contact <u>CfE@yriny.org.</u>
 - Additional guidance forthcoming.

FAQ- CLAIMING

- An approved Child Specific Prevention Plan (CSPP) must be in place to draw down federal reimbursement
- Multiple WMS POS lines for the same service may be needed if:
 - services start before a CSPP is approved
 - services continue and CSPP is not reauthorized on-time
 - Child's eligibility status changes mid-service
- Services falling within CSPP dates should be authorized using FFPSA specific vendor ids and purchase of service (POS) types
- Services falling outside of CSPP dates are still eligible for state reimbursement and should be authorized/claimed under existing vendor and POS types

SAMPLE CASE

Case Record	
FASP initiated	1/15/25
EBP Enrollment	1/30/25
FASP Approval	2/15/25
CSPP	2/15/25-2/14/26
EBP End Date	9/15/25

- A CSPP starts when an otherwise eligible child has an APPROVED FASP that includes delivery of a FFPSA EBP
- Services provided from 1/30-2/14/25 occurred prior to CSPP start date, so should be authorized in WMS using traditional vendor id and POS codes
- Services provided from 2/15/25- 9/15/25 are within the CSPP period and should be authorized within WMS using FFPSA specific vendor ids and POS types

SYSTEMS UPDATES

CONNECTIONS

- Connections Build 2 2024, is scheduled to released on January 22, 2025
- Automates the creation of a CSPP for otherwise eligible children upon approval of first FASP including an EBP submitted after build release date
 - Case Manager will need to verify eligibility/accuracy of FASP
 - New screens will display CSPP start and expiration date
- Candidacy codes- Activities
 - Insert update on automation process
- TIP SHEET currently being developed by PDP

OCFS DATA WAREHOUSE

- New report is being developed release date coming soon
- Allows users to select start/end date of a service period and returns:
 - Individuals with a day or more of active FFPSA EBP service during the specified window – as identified in FASP
- Useful for establishing WMS authorizations and monitoring FFPSA claiming
 - Child level details include
 - CIN, Connections and WMS caseid— costs should be split across eligible children
 - Type of FFPSA EBP (Mental Health, Substance Use, Parenting)- informs WMS POS type
 - Specific EBP Model (e.g., BSFT, FCU, FAU, FFT, etc)— should align with vendor id
 - EBP Start/End Dates
 - CSPP start and end dates- can
 - 18th birthdate
 - Foster care admission/discharge dates

WELFARE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

- WMS Title XX Matrix Update to include FFPSA
- WMS edit to require both DIR FF Family First and DIR 08 Foster Care to authorized FFPSA POS types when a CIN is age 18-21.
